
Geoff Barker

Soldier, author and analyst, is dedicated to recording and memorializing the airborne and special operations forces of the United States Army.

A native Englishman, he enlisted in 1956 in the British Parachute Regiment serving in the Middle East against the EOKA (Ethniki Organosis Kyprion Agoniston - National Organisation of Cypriot Fighters) Terrorist organization. Wounded in December 1958, he spent that Christmas in the RAF Hospital at Akrotiri, Cyprus.

Enlisting in the U.S. Army in 1965, his initial assignment was with the 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, North Carolina during Operation POWER PACK in the Dominican Republic.

His first assignment in the Republic of Vietnam was in 1966 with the 1st Brigade (Separate), 101st Airborne Division, through February 1968. From there, based on his former British counterterrorism experience, he was recruited as a military assignee detailed to the Combined Studies Division of the Far East Division, of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). He lead indigenous Provincial Reconnaissance



Units (PRU) — many of whom had formerly served with the North Vietnamese Army or Viet Cong, where his successes in capturing key underground Viet Cong Infrastructure resulted in his 1968 direct commissioning as a First Lieutenant of Infantry. Following his later promotion to Captain while still in Vietnam, he served as the Chief of PRU covering Military Region IV — the entire Mekong Delta, leading 16 Americans and 1,200 mercenaries. He left Southeast Asia in October 1970 for assignment to the 10th Special Forces Group (Airborne), Fort Devens, Massachusetts. Following a tour in Germany and various CONUS Special Forces and intelligence assignments, he retired in November 1987 as a Lieutenant Colonel, Division Chief, G-3 (Operations), 1st Special Operations Command (Airborne), Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

He served as the Chief of Staff, North Carolina Guard, and was advanced in 1988 to the grade of Colonel by Governor Jim Martin.

During December 1988 he was approached to relocate to Tampa Bay, Florida to assist in the initial development of the Joint Mission Analysis of the recently created United States Special Operations Command (USSOCOM). He relocated to MacDill Air Force Base in February 1989, remaining with USSOCOM until his retirement in August 2007 as a Senior Special Operations Analyst supporting the Joint Operations Center, Center for Special Operations, U.S. Special Operations Command.

He was a 1995 charter board member thru 2019 of the Special Opns Memorial Foundation Inc., MacDill Air Force Base, Florida.

He lives in Florida and also has a home in Newfoundland, Canada.
